Thank you very much for your interest in Spun Glass Theatre. We are seeking to appoint Trustees to our board as we take the step to register as a charity.

About Spun Glass Theatre

Spun Glass Theatre is an award-winning theatre production company based in Hastings, East Sussex, founded by Jessica Cheetham. Spun Glass Theatre blend groundbreaking theatre making with excellent community engagement. We are a young, dynamic company creating bold, visual, theatre productions for all ages with experience in traditional theatres, schools, community settings and developing early years activities. Each project is built from the ground up with its intended audience, ensuring that the end result is delightful, entertaining and meaningful.

We are currently funded on a project by project basis by Arts Council England with support from community funding pots including National Lottery Awards For All, Sussex Community Foundation, Chalk Cliff Trust and Tesco Community Foundation.

Past projects include This Noisy Isle in association with The Place Bedford, touring regionally 2019-2021. This family event based on The Tempest was an exciting interactive journey for family audiences, as if they had arrived on England's shores as refugees and needed to navigate a magical Shakespearean world to finally find a home.

We also distributed an accompanying digital version of This Noisy Isle created for Living Record Festival 2021, initially 100 packs via the Holbeck food bank, and then to 2,460 families served by 15 different food-banks across Central London (Southwark, Paddington), Greater London (Brent, Kingston), Croydon, Brighton and Hastings. Food bank partners sent back very positive feedback and requests for further packs.

Our First parent and baby groups run weekly - one in St Leonards-on-Sea and two in Brighton, providing a creative, playful and supportive space for new parents to come together. Our workshop leaders run entertaining, sensory sessions which create opportunities for parents and babies to be creative together, as well as share experiences and seek out support. The groups run on a combination of paid places (£8 a week) and funded free places for parents on Universal Credit, single parents and those aged under 25.

During the pandemic, Spun Glass Theatre created Theatre Search - a full free-to-access database of UK touring venues, which now powers The Public Campaign for the Arts interactive Arts Map.

Spun Glass Theatre also provides Arts Council England bid writing consultancy and project based access support for disabled and neurodivergent artists, raising over £750,000 from the Culture Recovery Fund.

We are currently embarking on our most ambitious project to date - the creation of Spun Glass Theatre - a fully accessible space for those both young and young at heart - a safe, vibrant and sensory world for little ones to experience their first taste of the arts.

Our vision for Spun Glass Theatre is to create a destination for a whole new generation of theatre goers; reimagining programming for a younger audience and creating events which bring children, parents, and siblings together. A space designed to immerse babies, toddlers and children in the magic of live performance.

Our aim is to find a home for Spun Glass Theatre in Hastings and St Leonards, to bring the local community together and to provide excellent cultural opportunities for children

from all backgrounds. We are building in options for Spun Glass Theatre to go on the road - able to tour to venues and festivals in 2025 and beyond.

Role profile - Responsibilities and Duties

Spun Glass Theatre is seeking to appoint Trustees for a two year term. The appointment will take place in Winter 2022. This is a voluntary and unremunerated position.

Trustees will be responsible for ensuring that Spun Glass Theatre is run sustainably and in accordance with its vision and aims. They will help us to register as a charity and refine/deliver on our new three year plan, spanning 2023-2025.

Trustees must share a passion for our artistic work and our commitment to being an equal, diverse and inclusive organisation.

We are looking for Trustees with experience in the following areas:

- Financial planning
- Fundraising, to be eager to bring new networks to Spun Glass Theatre;
- Willing and able to act as an ambassador for the organisation and to represent and promote it with funders and stakeholders at the highest levels;
- Theatre production and management

Time Commitment

It is suggested that Trustees would ordinarily need to commit to the equivalent of one to two days per month to perform their duties. This includes meeting and reading/prep time. Trustees are welcome to volunteer additional time to support the day to day and project operations for Spun Glass Theatre.

Locality

We have set up home in Hastings so whilst it is not essential for candidates to be based in the town, we will hold team meetings here and local knowledge is important to us when making work.
